This letter is to notify you that Workforce Safety & Insurance (WSI) was a victim of a cyber-attack. A North Dakota Information Technology Department (ITD) server that contained certain WSI data files was accessed by hackers. As of now, there is no evidence that the cyber-attackers moved or duplicated any WSI data.

The server contained WSI Incident Reports and Payroll Reports filed online between 2006 and 2013. These reports may include employee personal information such as names and social security numbers. No injured worker claim file information was contained on the breached server.

WSI takes security of personal information seriously. As a result we are contacting those employees, for whom we have an address, of the incident. WSI has also reached out to your employer and the media to enlist their help to inform the public of the incident.

WSI has contracted with AllClear ID., a nationally recognized company that specializes in identity protection services. AllClear ID will provide credit repair services, free of charge to all affected individuals. AllClear ID is also available to answer any questions regarding the security breach at toll-free 1-855-861-4022.

AllClear SECURE: The team at AllClear ID is ready and standing by if you need identity repair assistance. This service is automatically available to you with no enrollment required. If a problem arises, simply call 1-855-861-4022, provide your reference code and a dedicated investigator will do the work to recover financial losses, restore your credit and make sure your identity is returned to its proper condition. AllClear ID maintains an A+ rating at the Better Business Bureau.

We recommend that employees monitor their credit report for any unauthorized activity and contact AllClear ID if they notice anything suspicious.
